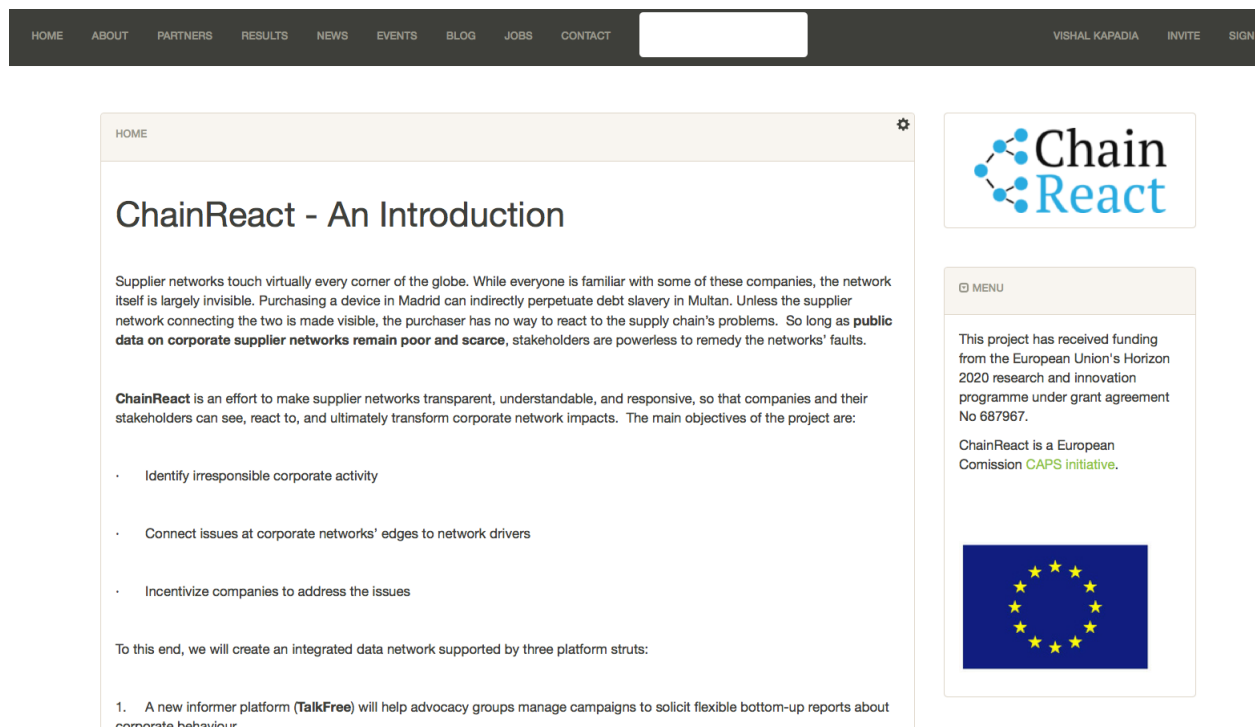


Figure 1: Screenshot of Website homepage including consortium logo and introduction to ChainReact's mission/ approach

The two below images refer to the homepage (Figure 1) and an informational page about the partners and what they bring to the project (Figure 2).
